3 RESPONSIBILITIES

- 3.1 Pray that you'll fulfil your responsibility in a way that glorifies God, encourages Christians and engages others.
- 3.2 In the week prior, list your prayer topics (e.g. consulting Appendix I: Table of Prayer Topics). Also identify any pre-written prayers you need to include (e.g. traditional prayer for that Sunday and/or the Lord's Prayer).
- 3.3 Consult relevant resources (e.g. prayer diaries, newsletters) to harvest prayer points about your topics.
- 3.4 Write your prayers in full, with appropriate language and length for the congregation's engagement. Optionally, for one or two topics, use an appropriate pre-written prayer (see Appendix III: Prayers for Various Topics).
- 3.5 On the Sunday you're reading, arrive 15 minutes early and make your presence known to the Service Leader. If possible, choose a seat that will allow you to reach the lectern quickly when it's time for the prayers.
- 3.6 At the announcement of the prayers, move to the front and adjust the microphone as necessary. Briefly greet the congregation and invite them to join you in prayer (e.g. 'Let's pray together.').
- 3.7 Pray clearly and steadily, concluding with the traditional prayer, the Lord's Prayer or otherwise as appropriate.
- 3.8 Seek or be willing to receive appropriate feedback on your fulfilment of this responsibility.
